Just remember there are many who will not be able to do this because many of our Veterans have lost loved ones and many Veterans have









For those of you who do not know, Sid was born in Warrensburg, Missouri on December 23, 1946, he was just shy of his 79<sup>th</sup> birthday when he joined Bob and Smitty

guarding Heaven's Pearly Gates. He joined the U. S. Marine Corps in late 1965 and attended boot camp at Marine Corps Recruit Depot San Diego, CA. Afterwards he attended avionics school at Naval Air Training Command in Memphis, Tennessee and went to the Marine Corps Air Station Beaufort, SC where he worked on a variety of aircraft including the A-4, F-8, F-4B, F-4J, and T-28. Sid went to Vietnam in 1969 where he spent a 13 month tour with HMM-362 helicopter squadron, the "Ugly Angels" as a door gunner on both the UH-34D and CH-46's out of the airbase at Phu

After his Vietnam Marine Corps service Sid served served for over 34 years at the Georgia Air National Guard working on the aircraft he loved inclduing the C-124, T-33, F-100, F-105G, F4D, F-15 and finally the B-1 Bomber. Sid was a teacher in the Cherokee County Schools, and later he published three Vietnam related music CD albums as the leader of the Tunnel Rats Band that he created.







Sid was a humble veteran when it came to his service recognition, and it was until the display of his medals, ribbons, badges and rank emblems at his Service that we saw the magnitude of his military achievements.

Kevin Marcy, owner of the Historic Cowan Mill in Acworth, three-times-a-year treats 80 or so Veterans to a gratuitous meal in the historic surroundings. At this particular luncheon honorable attention was paid to four (4) WWII Veterans along with a special appearance of Earline **Gaither** (age-100) as **Rosie-the-Riveter**. The four WWII veterans were Charlie Duncan (U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, age-106), Russell Vaudrey (U.S. Army Air Corps crewmember, age -103) Margol (U.S. Army Artillery, age-101) and Miles Willis (U.S. Navy, age-98, and turning 99 in January). Judy Gaither was also in attendance and escorted her mother Earline Gaither, who is a genuine Rosie-The-Riveter and worked on B-24 Bombers at the Ford Plant in Willow Run near Detroit, the very Bomber that our own Russell Vaudrey crewed during WWII in the Pacific Campaign.
